#### NOTES

- In order to be eligible for any player of the year award, the player must have competed in at least one NH Golf event where points are awarded.
- Junior and Senior players competing in Thomas J. Leonard Jr. Player of the Year events shall receive bonus points per the above points breakdown. Bonus points will be awarded in the Player of the Year standings applicable to the player and will only be available on that specific list.
- Players must compete in all rounds of the New Hampshire Open, New England Amateur, or any Regional Open to be eligible to receive points.
- All National Amateur Championships must have a rolling power ranking of 600, per the USGA's criteria, to be eligible to receive POY points.
- All team points are per player.
- Stroke Play Series points will be awarded based on field size. If the field is only 75% filled or has no more than 32 players, 1/2 points will be awarded. If the field is only 50% filled or has no more than 21 players, 1/4 points will be awarded. Total points for POY will be capped at 60.
- A player receives all points for qualifying in USGA events after qualifying is completed. A player receives all points for a USGA Championship after the championship proper has been completed.
- If any player wins a USGA Championship, they will be no less than co-player of the year.
- To receive points in the USGA local qualifying category, a player must have competed in a sanctioned USGA Qualifier. Players who earn exemptions into a USGA event will not receive local qualifying points.
- Any senior who competes and finishes in a VT, MA, or ME Open Championship will receive the same points as the Thomas J. Leonard Jr. spells out for those particular events.
